At its meeting of February 23, 2004, the Academic Senate passed the following Sense of the Senate Resolution presented by James Brent.

## SENSE OF THE SENATE RESOLUTION ENDORSEMENT OF PROPOSITION 56

Whereas	the California constitution is one of only three state constitutions that
	require state budgets to be passed by a 2/3 majority vote of both houses
	of the state legislature; and

Whereas	this constitutional provision has led to substantial gridlock. Although the
	California constitution requires budgets to be passed by June 15, the
	California budget has been adopted on time only once in the past 10
	years, and is often adopted as late as September or October; and

Whereas	this gridlock directly and adversely impacts San Jose State University, in
	that administrators, deans, department chairs and others frequently must
	plan for Fall semester without knowing what their budgets will be, severely
	hampering their ability to make optimal decisions regarding allocation of
	scare resources; and

Whereas	Proposition 56 ("State Budget. Related Taxes, and Reserve. Voting
	Requirements. Penalties") would lower the requirement for passing a state
	budget from 2/3 of the votes cast to 55% of the votes cast, thereby greatly
	increasing the chance that state budgets will be passed on time; be it
	therefore

Resolved	that the Academic Senate endorses Proposition 56 and urges its passage;
	be it additionally

Resolved	that the chair of the Academic Senate is encouraged to communicate the
	Senate's endorsement of this proposition in any manner that she deems
	fit.
